Thursday 21st January 2016


Present: Oliver S, Oliver C, Georgina, Jake, Mia, Luke, Eben, Raglan, Grace H and Mrs Puszczynska.

Points from the last meeting:

1. Following the idea of having a 5-a-side team Mrs P has organised a virtual sports event that will involve 3 teams playing different schools but at Egginton.
