In light of the questionnaire we have taken the following actions:

- **Homework** – As a staff, we have reviewed our Homework Policy and presented it to the Board of Governors. This will be sent home in due course.
  
- **Feeling safe/Bullying and behaviour** – The children in Egginton School show very high standards of behaviour and we are very proud of them. Through assembly time we have reiterated the school’s SMART Rules and discussed learning behaviours that are acceptable. This term the children have also followed the SEAL programme ‘Say no to bullying’ as a way of understanding what bullying is and supporting children in what to do if they feel unsafe.
  
- We have also highlighted the need for E Safety and put additional links on our website to support parents.
  
- **Informing parents about progress** – It was wonderful to see so many of you at Parents’ evening and I am sure your discussions with class teachers were very helpful. As you may be aware; as part of recent curriculum reforms, the government has removed levels to show pupils progress. We are currently working closely with other local schools to put in place a system that will be more meaningful for both staff and parents. As always however, if you have any questions about your child’s progress please speak to the class teacher.
