## **Chair Report for Egginton School PTA AGM on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2015**

The start of the academic year September 2014 saw the voting in of a new committee with myself as Chair, Emma Boyles as Co Chair (or deputy Chair as prefers to be known), Ros Farrow as Secretary and June Twedde as Treasurer. The new PTA committee with "L" plates also coincided with a term without a Head teacher and although the PTA did greatly appreciate the support provided by the interim cover Natasha Clark, it was great news when Karen Puszczynska joined the school as the permanent head.

The Autumn Term was the term where the majority of the fund raising events took place. Firstly the infamous duo of Pete Strain & Steve Higgins kindly agreed to host a "Back to School" Quiz with all proceeds raised going to support Egginton PTA. The event was a sell out, with a bar, auction, raffle, it raised a truly amazing £1089 & was a brilliant night with lots of giggles.

The Xmas Fayre was equally a well-supported, organised event with many parents, teachers and children running stalls, selling crafts, baking cakes and a school band opening the event. The official stall holders commented on the lovely atmosphere and it was attended by many people from the village. The event raised a magnificent £843 and put everyone in the Festive Spirit. The Christmas Raffle Draw was also given the hard sell – with tickets in books bags, sales at Xmas Fayre and Play, tickets sales pushed at Etwall leisure centre and outside Aldi. In total this raised another £887.

In the Spring Term the annual Soup and Pancake event was kindly hosted by Sim and Bob Robertson, in which turned out to be a perfect venue, both in terms of seating space and the amount of crockery & "stuff" available to support the feeding of approx. 60 people. The event was sociable, with a lovely selection of homemade soups and raised just short of £500.

In the Summer Term there was a breaking with tradition with the Church Fete agreeing to share a percentage of the takings with the school. The school supported the Fete with raffle ticket sales through book bags, running stalls and baking cakes. Mrs Puszczynska opened the event and felt the pressure of judging the hotly contested American themed fancy dress competition. The contribution towards the school funds is expected to be in region of £500.

In addition to the above, other ongoing fund raisers included the bonus ball which Helen Hartshorne is kindly coordinating & brings in over £1100 per year. Together with Bags to School & School Calendars the total raised in the last academic year was a significant £4800.

Working with Mrs Puszczynska this money has been spent for both practical reasons and to make the school and its environment more appealing. This includes new tables and chairs for Tigers classroom, bouncers for the canopy posts, colourful weatherproof notice boards, outdoor learning equipment in addition to funding fun activities for the children such as circus skills, part funding the school trip etc.

Everything achieved by the PTA requires contribution from a committed team of helpers and organisers. I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone, parents, teachers and children for their support of the PTA. The money raised really does make a big difference to the school and benefits our children. I look forward to another successful year and welcome the continued support.
