



EGGINTON PRIMARY SCHOOL PUPIL PREMIUM

What is it?

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

In most cases the Pupil Premium is allocated to schools and is clearly identifiable. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools per FSM pupil, is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

How will we know it is working?

We track every child's progress in key areas each term at a 'Pupil Progress Meeting' between teachers and the head teacher. We measure performance before and after specific interventions to identify the impact on learning. Parents are invited to Parent Teacher Consultations and they also

receive an annual school report for their child. Both of these identifies if current attainment is above, in line with, or below national expectations. Learning behaviours and attitudes towards learning demonstrated by the children are discussed with pupils and staff members on a termly basis.
