School Sports Funding. What is it?

From April 2013, the Government is providing £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport in schools. Physical education will leave students with a legacy of success, facilitating a healthy and active lifestyle.

This Sports Premium funding will be ring fenced to be used for sport and PE, and schools will be able to determine what they believe to be the most appropriate use of this funding.

Funding will be allocated through a lump sum for each school and a per-pupil top-up mechanism. Egginton Primary School received £8255 in funding during the 2016/17 academic year.

Egginton Primary School will be receiving sports funding £16,700 in the 2017/18 academic year in light of the new changes to Sports funding.

PE Vision Statement

At Egginton Primary School we value and celebrate the role of PE and sport has in the education, enjoyment and well-being of our pupils.

We ensure the provision is of high quality and allows all children to reach their full potential. We have benefitted by working in close partnership with Premier Sports and South Derbyshire Sports Partnership during the 2016/17 academic year.

We provide continuous professional development (CPD) for staff involved in the delivery of PE and school sport, and work alongside clubs to provide strong links and effective pathways into activities outside of school.

PE development through funding 2016/17

Budget received: £8255

Action	Impact
High quality PE sessions taught by specialist coaches	Majority of pupils have made good progress in areas of PE. Staff have had opportunities to develop skills and practice through observation of specialist coaches. Eg Cricket through the Chance to Shine Program
Extra-curricular clubs	School have subsidised the provision of a wide range of after school sports clubs for all year groups. The uptake has

	been extremely positive with the significant majority of pupils attending at least one sports club this year.
Sports competitions	Funding has enabled us to participate in inter-school sports competitions including the Football Prominent Cup. For a small school this competitive experience was extremely valuable for our pupils.
Bike ability	Our older pupils participated in the Bike Ability course to develop vital cycle safety skills
Healthy lifestyles and Team work class based learning	Pupils in Key Stage 2 attended a programme of lessons to help deepen their understanding of healthy lifestyles and reflect on team work skills
Equipment	A number of PE equipment purchases have been made to update resources and ensure resource provision is appropriate.
Staff training course	Lunch time supervisors attended a course to develop engagement with sport and team work activities at lunch time.
Enrichment experiences	Through the Chance to Shine/ Unicef initiatives Key Stage 2 pupils represented the school as mascots for players during the England Vs New Zealand Women's World Cup match. This once in a life time experience was a year highlight for many pupils.
ICT tracking system	ICT website used to track and assess progress of pupils towards key PE objectives.

PE funding 2017/18

Budget £16,700 proposed expenditure:

Area	Cost	Proposed Action
CPD/Training/Staffing	£8000 approx.	Specialist coaches to deliver PE sessions alongside staff to enhance CPD sessions. Developing the skills of staff to lead areas of PE and Healthy lifestyles. Appoint a lunch time play leader to lead and coordinate active games during lunch time sessions.
Inter-school Sports competitions	£3000 approx.	Wide involvement at inter-school events. Sports Premium to cover cost of staff attending sessions and transport to and from sessions.
Resources and equipment	£2000 approx.	Purchase and replenishment of PE resources to ensure high quality resources for lessons
Extra-curricular clubs and activities	£2000 approx.	Premium to subsidise cost of a wide variety of sports clubs to cater to different interests.

Enrichment experiences	£1000 approx.	Themed days/sessions to provide pupils with the opportunity to experience more sports and healthy activities they have not participated in before.
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All funding will be used to enhance and develop our PE and School Sport for all and in a way which is sustainable for the future.
